TO: President Weimer K. Hicks

- RE: 1. To clarify the racist programming procedure and to state the remedy.
2. To state the black students who desire to live together spring quarter and to set up a mechanism to perform this function every quarter.

FROM: The Black Student Organization

(1) In the reply to the B.S.O.'S charge of a racist programming procedure now being the rule in WJMD, it was stated that students(white) complained about the soul(black) music being played by WJMD and to accomodate these complaints the new programming procedure was created. It is in the altering of the programming procedure to accomodate these complaints that the act of racism was committed. The "racist" changes were:

- (1) Imposing a racist TOP 40 SURVEY on black discjockeys
- (2) Limiting the prime time shows available to black discjockeys

The acceptable remedy to the situation on the part of B.S.O.:

- (1) Lifting of the racist TOP 40 Survey restrictions on black discjockeys
- (2) The allotment of the follow additional prime

time slots to black discjockeys:

(A) 3P.M.-9P.M.; Monday

(B) 9P.M.-10P.M.; Tuesday

(C) 10P.M.-11P.M.; Thursday

(1) Women's Dormitory-Freshman Women should have a black counselor.

(3) Black Resident Assistant

(With the moving of (FRESHMAN) Bruce Kelley into Crissey with other black upperclassmen a precedent has been set.)

(3) Mechanism for quaters beyond spring for black students who wish to live together to do so.

(1) Forms should be sent to "all" incoming black students asking do they desire to live together with "all" the other black students. On the basis of the answers to this question a space should be allotted to accommodate all the black students who desire to live together. It should be noted that the best dormitories for this purpose are Crissey (Men's Dorms) and Trowbridge (Women's Dorm)

(2) Black counselors for incoming freshman women should be provided.

(3) Black counselors should be hired to preside over black freshman students

(1) Counselors also to serve as resident assistants in Men's Dorms.
