

THE FACILITIES

The Kalamazoo College Natatorium is one of the finest facilities of its kind. Built in 1969, it was extensively renovated in 1985. One entire wall of the natatorium is glass, affording a beautiful view of the campus. The natatorium is directly across the street from the Anderson Athletic Center, which houses the College's main gymnasium.

COACH LYN MAURER

Lyn Maurer has coached the Hornet women's swim team since 1970. Her overall coaching record is 118-72, with an MIAA record of 66-24. Her teams have won five MIAA championships, including two consecutive titles to begin the 1990s. Maurer holds a BA and an MA from Western Michigan University. An associate professor of physical education, she is also director of women's athletics at Kalamazoo College.

DIVING COACH RON BRAMBLE

Kalamazoo's swimming and diving teams will receive a big boost this winter as Ron Bramble enters his second year as a member of the Hornet coaching staff.

Bramble, an 18-year veteran, has coached at Kalamazoo College previously and is best known to Hornet fans as the coach of Lynn Achterberg Offerdahl, a diver who became the first and only Kalamazoo female athlete to win a national championship in 1985.

Bramble has coached five high school All-American divers, including the No. 1-ranked high school diver in the United States two years ago. Bramble is also an aquatic instructor in the Portage Public Schools.

WOMEN'S SWIMMING OUTLOOK

The Kalamazoo College women's swimming and diving team has a proud tradition of success. In the 1991 season its dual meet record was 9-2 with the two losses coming at the hands of NCAA Division II teams. The Hornets have won the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association title two of the last three years, and they were runners-up in 1991. Four Hornet women were named to the all-conference team and two competed in the NCAA Division III championships.


In 1992-93, a strong and experienced group of returning swimmers will be joined by a promising first-year contingent, making prospects favorable for another outstanding season.

Leading the returning team members is a talented and dedicated group of seniors, including captain Katie Czmer. Katie is an All-MIAA swimmer who is league champion in the 1,650 and 500 freestyles and is a two-year NCAA qualifier. She earned All-American status in 1991 in the 1,650 and also garnered Academic All-American honors.

Senior diver Kellie Warner is an All-MIAA selection and conference champion who earned All-American honors in 1990 in three-meter diving. Senior captain Cindy Grush is also a returning All-MIAA swimmer in the freestyle and breaststroke. Senior captain Gina Welscott will be counted on heavily in the sprint freestyles. The fourth-year contingent will also be strengthened by the return of two former All-MIAA selections, Heather Botsford and Julie Delamarter, both of whom missed last year's competition because of foreign study.

strong part of this year's team, led by juniors Bess German in the butterfly and freestyle; Melanie McCormack, a 1990 All-MIAA pick in the freestyle; and Amy Lancaster in the backstroke and butterfly. Five returning sophomores will be led by Michelle Michael, who holds the Kalamazoo College record in the 100-yard backstroke.

A number of first-year students will be solid additions to the team, with diver Rachel

Wawro and sprinter Anita Grinbergs leading the group.

In an ever-improving MIAA, Kalamazoo will need strong performances from all of its swimmers and divers to remain in the hunt for the league championship, but strong leadership and experience from the large senior class should prove a deciding factor in favor of the the Hornets.
