



HEAD COACH JOE HAKLIN

Joe Haklin enters his sixth season as head coach of the Kalamazoo College men's basketball team. In his first five campaigns, the Hornets have compiled an impressive 80-46 mark. Haklin previously served as head assistant coach at Western Michigan University from 1982-87.

Haklin earned Academic All-American status in basketball as a three-sport athlete at Wabash College. From 1979 to 1982, he was an assistant basketball coach at Wayne State University, where he earned his master's degree. Haklin established the annual Junior Hornet Basketball Camp, held for the fourth time this past summer in Kalamazoo.

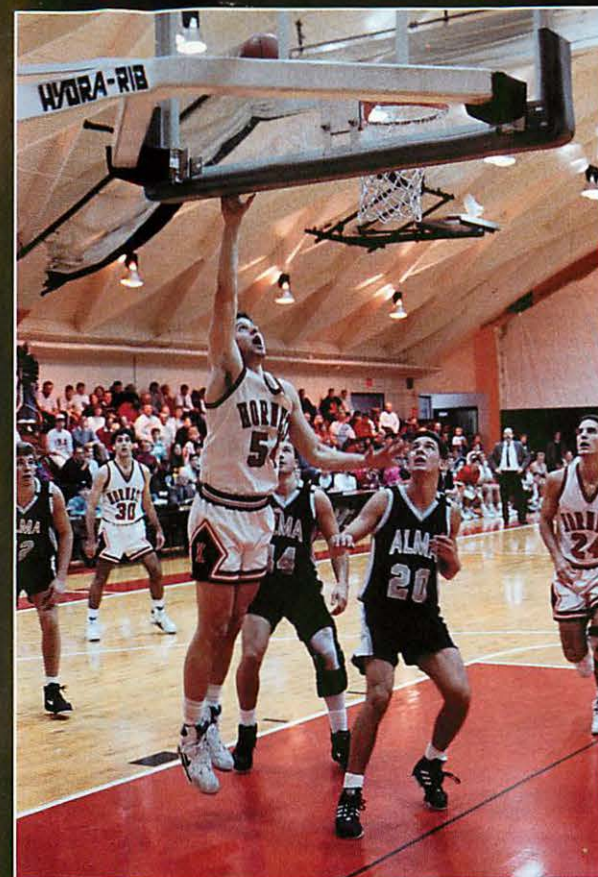

MEN'S BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

Coming off an impressive campaign which saw them advance to within one game of the NCAA tournament, the Kalamazoo College Hornets are excited about the 1992-93 season. Kalamazoo surprised most observers during what was supposed to be a rebuilding year, posting a 16-11 record and finishing third in the league. The Hornets advanced to the championship game of the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) tournament before bowing to eventual national champion Calvin College.

Although first team all-conference player Brian Witkowski has graduated, the Hornets are returning a fine nucleus of veteran players. Captain-elect Rob Passage, a forward, returns for his fourth varsity campaign. He led last year's team in rebounding with 148 and in field goal percentage (.532). Another three-year letterwinner, 6'7" Mark Chappell, returns for his senior campaign in the post position. Completing the senior class are lettermen Ron Foor and Scott Scheel.

Two experienced juniors will help the Hornet cause this season. Jon Njus, a 6'2" guard, averaged 10.7 points per game as a sophomore. His inside counterpart, 6'6" Jeff VanderWiere, averaged 8.3 points and five rebounds per game. Other juniors expected to contribute this season are Corey Dean, Bill Higgins, and Steve Vanderstelt.

The sophomore class contingent is led by two front-line players, 6'5" Andy Hobik and 6'6" Dean Woolcock. They will be joined by a talented first-year class whose academic credentials (3.71 GPA) are as impressive as their athletic accomplishments.

Anderson Athletic Center will be an exciting place as the Hornets play 13 home games on a court where they've posted a 37-9 record during the last four seasons. The Hornets will continue to rely on their trade-
