

Jacquelyn Anderson Mattfeld

Mr. President, I have the honor to present as a candidate for an honorary degree JACQUELYN ANDERSON MATTFELD, teacher, scholar, musician, musicologist, administrator, and dedicated servant of the humanities. Since her undergraduate years at Goucher College, she has rendered distinguished service to higher education as Director of Financial Aid and Associate Dean of Instruction at Radcliffe, as Lecturer and Director of Theses in Music at Harvard, as Professor of Music, Dean, and Provost at Sarah Lawrence and Brown University, and currently as President of Barnard College. Yale University, where she received her doctorate in 1959, awarded her the prestigious Wilbur Lucius Cross Medal in 1979. Numerous advisory boards, among others the New York Philharmonic, the Yale University Council, the American Management Association, the Women's College Coalition, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the American Council on Education, have been enriched by her talent, humaneness, and wisdom. From her field of music she has drawn the fundamental concept of harmony and has nurtured it in the deliberations over which she presides.

Therefore, on behalf of the Faculty of Kalamazoo College, I recommend that upon JACQUELYN ANDERSON MATTFELD be conferred the honorary degree, Doctor of Humane Letters.
