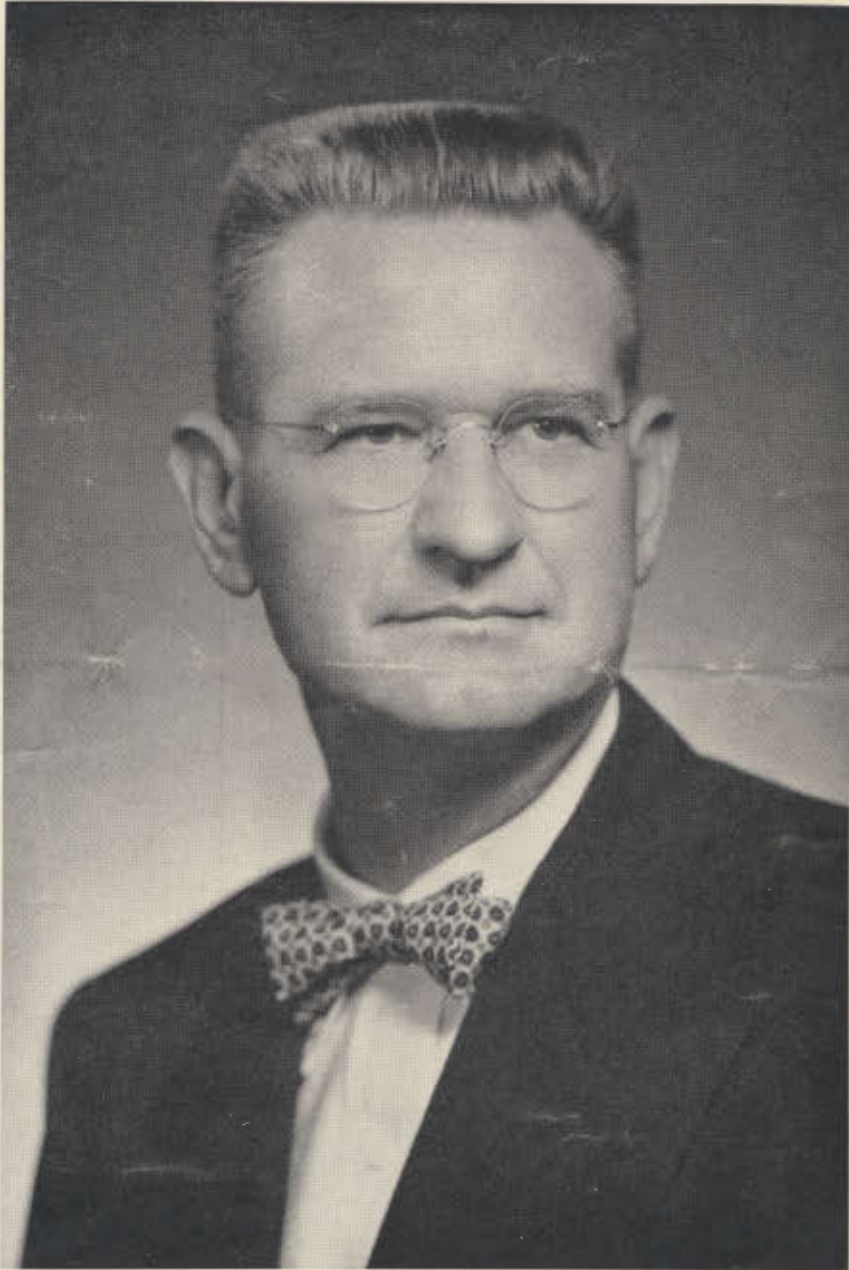

This season's football programs are dedicated to the late H. Colin Hackney, a great competitor while at Kalamazoo, a loyal fan throughout his later life. His influence will be felt in Kalamazoo College athletics in the years to come.

ROLLA L. "RED" ANDERSON, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS AND HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

The 34 year old redhead from southern Illinois is oiling the wheels of a rusty athletic program. The trial period being over, this is the year to watch. The first year's 1-7 record serves not as an evaluation of Anderson's ability, but rather as a rule for measuring improvement.

A big job of rebuilding is ahead of the Coach, but as can be seen by the 27 incoming freshmen on the football team, he believes "actions speak louder than words." Anderson has proved he can take it and from here on it's up.

Rolla was a high school star at Mount Vernon, Illinois. He played on the National Championship basketball team from Southeastern Missouri College, Camp Girardeau, Missouri, which won the Kansas City tourney in 1943. At the outbreak of World War II he joined the Marines. He attended school at Western Michigan College and was a star in football and basketball. He received his B.S. from Western in 1944, teacher's certificate in 1946, and his Master's from the University of Michigan in 1951.

Anderson posted an outstanding record at Battle Creek Lakeview and left behind him a State Championship team to come to Kalamazoo.

JOSEPH BOGART, ASSISTANT FOOTBALL COACH

Joe Bogart, a 28 year old assistant coach from Sturgis, graduated from Michigan State College where he played halfback and just last summer received his Master's degree. During the war he was a quarterback at Fort Knox and when in San Antonio, Texas, coached the Texas Military Institute's football squad. Joe first worked with Anderson at Battle Creek Lakeview and was selected by Anderson as his assistant at Kalamazoo.

overshifted six-man line.

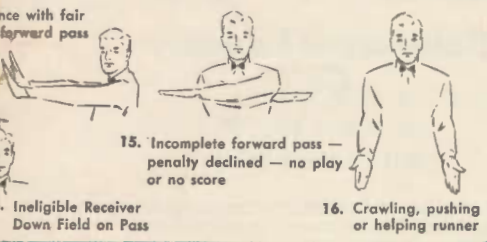

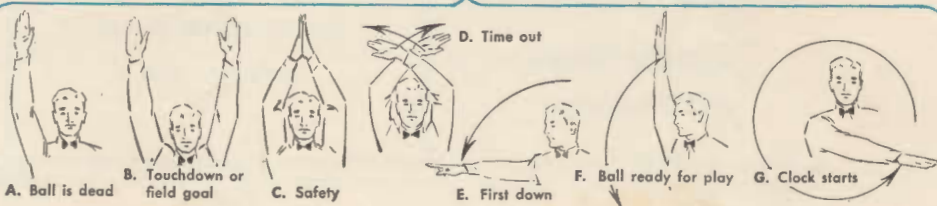

Returning from three years in the Coast Guard he is now married and a father. One of the fastest men on the squad. Enrolled in pre-law.
- BOWEN, JACK:** Guard, 6-1, 205, Senior, 21, Kalamazoo.
A graduate of Kalamazoo Central High school he is now entering his fourth year of college ball. A chemistry major and College K-Club president.
- BROWN, CHARLES:** Tackle, 6, 190, Sophomore, 21, Kalamazoo.
Originally from Ft. Wayne, Ind. where he was All-City end in 1951, he spent a year and a half in the Navy before coming to Kalamazoo. Is now married and a father. An economics major.
- COASH, BOB:** Halfback, 5-10, 180, Sophomore, Kalamazoo.
co-captain, hard hitting offensive right half and defensive linebacker. Transfer student from Notre Dame.
- COPELAND, BOB:** Center, 5-11, 176, Senior, 21, Watervliet.
Recipient of last year's most valuable player award. Has put on weight during the summer. An economics major.
- DOYLE, JACK:** Guard, 6, 185, Senior, 21, Kalamazoo.
Graduated from Kalamazoo Central in 1951 where he played center and received All-City, All-Conference, and All-State honors for his line-backing. Is now married. An economics major.

- LANDERYOU, VICTOR:** End, 6, 170, Sophomore, 19, Saginaw.
