Squad members themselves have set enthusiastic goals for this season, which should significantly boost K-College's cross country fortunes.

John Griffin brings a lot of coaching experience to his first season with Kalamazoo College. He has served as head track coach at Mattawan High School and as assistant track and cross country coach at Loy Norrix High School. He also has coached women's cross country at Kalamazoo Central for 3 years and coached men's cross country at South Junior High School, where he helped organize the junior high cross country program for the Kalamazoo Public Schools. Griffin ran cross country and track at Kalamazoo Valley Community College for two years. He finished 7th in the nation in the 1,000 yard run at the Junior College Indoor Nationals in 1975 and came in 8th in 1976.

Football

The Kalamazoo College football fortunes for 1980 are still uncertain, since last year's graduation took a heavy toll, especially "up front" in the offensive and defensive lines. Of the starting interior six offensive linemen, only senior Jim Lait returns as a seasoned blocker to provide the needed leadership to a young group of eager offensive replacements in the blocking corps. Lait, along with seniors Tim Carlson, Rich Counsman and Tom Ranville, have been selected by their teammates as captains for the 1980 season. Sophomore Jack Lawless returns with playing experience in K-College's successful 4-3 College version of the Pro-4 defense, having replaced an injured starter early last season.

The so-called "skilled positions" indicate real strength for 1980, with All-League Quarterback Tom Ranville returning to pass and hand-off to a very capable group of receivers and running backs. Brian Krueger returns as an All-League receiver and was voted Most Valuable Player by his teammates in 1979. Two other excellent receivers, Tim Pobuda and Pat Flaharty, return to keep defenders from "keying" too heavily on Krueger. Two veteran running backs return as seniors, Rich Counsman and Tony Cholometes, ably supported by Dennis Warkentien, Greg Shinsky, Bob Rymiszewski and Lou Langermann.

Perhaps the strongest linebacker corps to take the field in the history of Hornet football will include Tim Carlson, Dave Held, Mitch Aiello and Kevin Kansman. Kansman, coming off a leg injury of two seasons ago, could provide the winning edge to the defensive unit. He was an All-League player in 1978. In the defensive secondary, Paul Dillon, Most Valuable Freshman from the 1979 squad, and veteran Bob Micunek will be joined by untested teammates to complete that defensive foursome.

With only one lineman returning from the starting offensive and defensive lines, the coaching staff is faced with a monumental rebuilding assignment. However, Coach Baker is optimistic that the squad of approximately 80 eager Hornets will be able to carry on the momentum of solid back-to-back winning seasons in 1978 and 1979.

Head Coach: Ed Baker

Head football and track coach and associate professor of physical education, Ed Baker has led Kalamazoo College football squads for 14 seasons. He has a lifetime winning record of 95-77-4 in 22 years of college and high school coaching. He has served as chairman of the NCAA Division III track and field record committee. Coach Baker is a graduate of Denison University where he earned seven varsity letters in football, track and lacrosse.

Assistant Coaches: Bob Kent, Dick Raklovits, Chuck Comer and Bill Rowekamp

Four veteran coaches will again comprise the 1980 football coaching staff. Bob Kent, associate professor of physical education and head swimming coach at the College, will work with the defensive backs. Dick Raklovits will be the defensive coordinator and will work with the linebackers. Chuck Comer will guide the offensive backs and wide receivers. Bill Rowekamp will supervise the defensive line, while Baker will take responsibility for the offensive line.
