A 1963 graduate of Kalamazoo College, Comeau was a track and football standout at Three Rivers High School and "K" College. A high and low hurdler and quarter miler, he was named MVP for four years and was also team captain for three of those years.

A versatile athlete, Comeau was co-captain of the undefeated, untied football team of 1962, playing defensive end.

Comeau has been a coach in the Southwestern Michigan Women's Soccer Association for several seasons and currently serves as director of alumni relations at the College.

Last season the Hornets were 0-11-1 in the MIAA and 0-16-1 overall. Defensively, the team played well, but the lack of offense contributed to a series of frustrating losses, including 0-1 defeats to Hope, Olivet, and Alma and a non-conference loss to Western Michigan University.

Football

A huge graduation loss of 18 men, 7 offensive starters and 5 defensive starters will make the 1984 season dependent on the fast maturation of younger football players to come forth and be counted early in the season.

Offensively, "K" will be relying on the leadership and talents of elected captains Mike Howlett and Tom Dopp. Mike was the starting quarterback last year and was the league's overall (all-game) passing leader. Tom was a starting halfback and is known for his hard, determined running. The lone defensive line starter is Vince Dattilo. Vince's 6'2, 247 lb. frame will combine with a returning Greg Root at 6'3, 250 lbs. to provide a counted-on blocking machine. Other returnees that must step in and realize their potential include seniors Brad Jensen and Mike Knudstrup; juniors John Kline, Mike Rose, Dave Jeffries, and Dan Caruso; and sophomores Scott Hall and Todd Jensen.

Defensively, captain Eric Krelick will lead from his line-backer spot with a supporting cast of returning starters, seniors Kevin Belew and Mike Benson; juniors Bill Schneider and Dave Bright; and sophomores Chris Mack, Matt Broderick and Bill Howlett. Other defensive players to watch include a local pair of sophomores, Pat Gibbons and Pat Beyers of Kalamazoo Hackett, and senior Sean Kowalski.

Last year the phrase, "Better than expected," was used to describe a team that has been picked for last often and has never ended up there. This year, the phrase, "Expect better," will be used every day to inspire the Hornets, who have their most demanding schedule in recent history, to a winning campaign in 1984.

Former assistant coaches Bob Kent, Chuck Comer, and Dick Raklovits will direct the Hornets for the 1984 campaign. Kent is serving as head coach, but will share many of the traditional head coaching responsibilities with Comer, offensive coach, and Raklovits, defensive coach.

The trio fills the vacancy created by the loss of 17-year veteran head coach Ed Baker, who left coaching to accept the full-time responsibilities for directing the "K" College career development center.

Bob Kent is best known for his highly successful role as head coach of the Hornets' men's swimming team, which has captured the MIAA title every year since 1972. Bob is an associate professor of physical education at "K" and has been an assistant football coach, working primarily with defensive backs, since coming to the College in 1968.

Chuck Comer and Dick Raklovits have both been assistant coaches at "K" since 1975. Comer has 23 years experience in high school and college coaching, primarily with offensive backs and receivers. Dick Raklovits was defensive coordinator under Ed Baker and brings 26 years of coaching experience to his position.

Rounding out the coaching staff are Van Nickert, offensive line; Mike Taylor, receivers; Bill Rowekamp, defensive line; and Al Curtis, student assistant coach from WMU.

Soccer

Characteristic of any small college varsity program, this year's team will again be in a situation where valuable members of the squad were lost because of graduation. Principal losses were captains and all-conference performers John Galindo and Bob Muns, the latter last year's MVP. Fortunately, a number of seasoned and talented letter-winners return, including senior starters Mike Theodoulou in goal and Jim Zadeh in the sweeper position, as well as sophomore defensemen Kevin Kitka and Paul Regelbrugge and sophomore striker Jon Beaubien.

The reconstruction of the midfield and the addition of depth to the forward line are considered to be the most challenging tasks toward the composition of an effective and competitive squad. Coach Fuchs believes that the quality of incoming freshmen can accomplish this. He considers the recruiting harvest the best ever and points to a number of new players with impressive credentials: All-staters Marc Tirikian, Mike Greening, and John Kennedy; state-select Adam Cermak; Franz-Josef Henne, who has playing experience in the West German Oberliga Westfalen; and a number of recruits who sport all-league and all-county status. Expected to return also is senior goaltender Jeff Coran, who spent last season on foreign study in France.

Volleyball

"I don't know what to expect from this year's team," notes Jeanne Hess, who is making her "K" College coaching debut this year.

Hess adds, "I am looking for some good play from senior Kim Stewart, who is returning to the team from foreign study last year. She should be one of the mainstays on the team, along with our only other senior, Sue Case."

"I believe 'K' finished close to last place in the MIAA conference last year; if this is true, we have nowhere to go but up!"
