I have the honor to present as candidate for an honorary degree

Frederick William Heyl;

Bachelor of Philosophy and Doctor of Philosophy in Chemistry from Yale University, for thirty years a notable contributor in the area of Organic Chemistry and by his original work enriching the fundamental knowledge in the fields of Metabolism, Gland Substances, Arsenical Derivatives, Pollen and other problems vital to human well-being.

For twenty-four years he has administered the Research Laboratories of The Upjohn Company and is the inspirer and counsellor of thirty-two men engaged in research work. For more than ten years he has been the Director of Research work in Organic Chemistry in Kalamazoo College.

I recommend that upon Mr. Heyl as an outstanding scholar and an original contributor to significant advances in science and the developer and administrator of a nationally recognized research staff the Degree of Doctor of Science be conferred.
