KALAMAZOO, Mich. -- The Board of Directors of the F. W. Heyl and Elsie L. Heyl Science Scholarship Fund of Kalamazoo College has named Henry Hongki Tang as the winner of a full tuition scholarship to Yale University for 1974-75.

Tang, a senior at Kalamazoo College majoring in physics and mathematics, will graduate Phi Beta Kappa this month and will be majoring in physics when he starts at Yale in the fall.

A native of Hong Kong, China, Tang is the son of Mrs. Tang Chenng King-Chui. He attended the Oak Ridge National Science Semester during his junior year, a program of the Great Lakes Colleges Association.

The Heyl Scholarship Fund was established through the will of the late Dr. Heyl, a former Upjohn Company vice-president and director of research. From 1923 until his retirement, he was the director of the Upjohn Scholars Program at the College, by whose encouragement many 'K' graduates went on to do work at Yale University. The Fund also awards scholarships in the amount of full tuition to the Bronson Methodist Hospital School of Nursing and to Kalamazoo College.

The scholarships are renewable as long as the recipient maintains a good academic record and continues to major in the exact sciences.
