President Rainsford elected national chairman

President Rainsford was elected chairman of the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities during the association's annual conference held February 6 and 7 in Washington, D.C. He replaces Dr. Steven Muller, president of The Johns Hopkins University.

The NAICU, composed of over 800 members from both large and small institutions, was established in 1976 to provide a unified national voice for the shaping of public policy to promote independent higher education. "The National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities," commented President Rainsford following his election, "is committed to working toward the implementation and funding of public policy directly supportive of students who choose to attend independent institutions and the institutions they attend."
