MI COVID-19 COMMUNITY RESPONSE

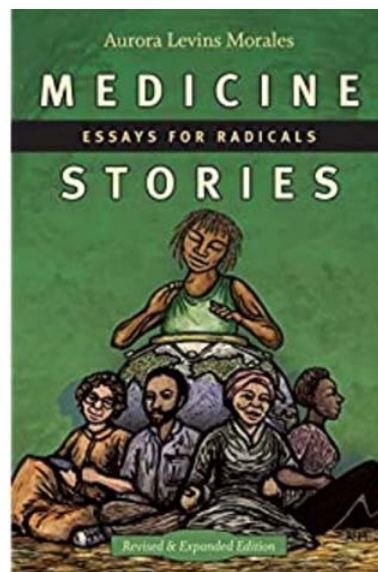
